

The COMMISSIONERS appointed by ACT

In the following Order, viz.

A Valuable PIECE of LAND, bounding East on  
King-street, West on Arch-lale-Street, North on  
a sixteen foot alley laid out to said streets, and South  
on lands of Messrs. William Hopton and William  
Logan. This parcel of land is divided into ten lots;  
four on the above two streets of 38 by 114 feet, and  
six on the alley of 40 by 76 feet each. These ten lots  
will be the first day's sale.

On the following day will be sold,

Two BASTIONS and a REDAN on the Bay of  
Charleston; first, Craven's Bastion, at the foot of Go-  
vernor's Bridge, measuring on the North side 153  
feet, on the East side 195 feet, on the South side 65  
feet, and on the Bay 74 feet. In this Bastion is a to-  
lerable Dwelling House, and a quantity of removable  
earth on the ramparts.—Second, the Redan opposite  
to Commodore Gillon's, measuring on the North  
63 1-2 feet, on the South 60 feet, and 70 feet on the  
Bay. This piece of ground would be suitable for a  
small work-shop.—Third, Granville's Bastion, South  
end of the Bay, measuring on the North side 103 1-2  
feet, on the East side 103 1-2 feet, on the South side  
116 1-2 feet, and on the West side 75 1-2 feet. In  
this Bastion also is a tolerable House. And

On Wednesday will commence the Sale of
